## Our Recent Projects

### **Community Cohesion Project**

Donor: Global Affairs Canada through UNDP

Through implementing this project 2100 host community youth living in Ukhyia and Teknaf Upazila are receiving training on different skills like beauty care, industrial sewing machine and tailoring, electric house wiring and solar system, poultry rearing, handicrafts (bamboo and cane), handloom, plumbing, tiles Fitting, street food production and service (pickles), dry fish processing, driving etc. A total of 430 trainees have already received certificates and loans from Department of Youth Development, 366participants who found employment six month after receiving training, 322 trained participants have completed apprenticeship and 95 have found job through job placement.



### **Community Cohesion Project**

Donor: UNDP through its EALG project

Through implementing this project 500 host community youth living in Ukhyia and Teknaf Upazila are receiving training on different skills like electric house waring and solar system, electronics and mobile phone serv icing, plumbing, tiles fitting, street food production and service, dry fish processing, poultry rearing and small business



# Skills for Employment Investment Programme (SEIP)

Donor: Asian Development Bank (ADB) and Swiss Agency for Development and Cooperation (SDC) through PKSF

Description: 1200 youths are getting different skills training like sewing machine operation, auto mechanics, wielding and IT support service. Already 850 participants have received different market relevant skills. Among them 306 participants are now employed in different organizations and 212 participants are self employed. The project is implemented in Khulna and Satkhira district.



# Prevention and Elimination of Hazardous Form of Child labour in Coastal Area of Bangladesh

Donor: Educo Bangladesh

Description: The project is being implemented in Shyamnagar upazila of Satkhira district. The project is significantly contributing to the reduction of hazardous forms of child labour and exploitation in the selected informal sectors in the coastal areas of Bangladesh. One hundred youths are currently getting opportunities to receive technical training through this project



## **School Feeding Programme**

**Donor: Primary Education Directorate (GoB)** 

Description: Distributed 75 gram fortified biscuits three days and mid day meal three days among 35,372 students from 133 government primary schools. All Government primary school children of Jhikargacha upazila under Jashore district received this support.



# Vulnerable Group Development Programme (VGD) for 2022-2023 cycle

Donor: Dept. of Women and Children Affair's (GoB)

Description: Ultra poor 2652 VGD women in Koyra Upazila of Khulna district are receiving monthly food ration for the household and support for income generation.



### **Uttaran IDCOL ICS Program**

**Donor: IDCOL (An autonomous Government body)** 

Description:IDCOL Improved Cook Stove (ICS) program was inaugurated by the Honorable Prime Minister of Bangladesh in May 2013 with the dissemination target of 1 million ICS in Bangladesh within December 2018. IDCOL received necessary financial support from the World Bank and the Government of Bangladesh. The objectives of the program are to reduce GHG emissions, solid fuel use for cooking and the impact of Indoor Air Pollution (IAP) - which substantially affects women and children - by creating a sustainable market-based approach towards adoption of higher efficiency cook-stoves in the country Dissemination of improved cooking stoves is the main activity of our project. 36,000 huseholds are the beneficiaries of this project. c



### Bio gas project of IDCOL

Donor: : Infrastructure Development Company Limited (IDCOL) (An autonomous Government body)

IDCOL has been implementing biogas program in Bangladesh since 2006 with support from the World Bank, KfW Development Bank and SNV Netherlands Development Organization. Biogas plants not only provide gas for cooking purpose but also produce organic fertilizer for the crops and fish pond. The program helps reduce the use of biomass fuel for cooking. IDCOL finances plants with daily gas production capacity ranging from 1.2 m3 to 25.0 m3 thereby meeting demand of both domestic households and mid-sized dairy and poultry farms. IDCOL currently finances two models of biogas plants: brick-cement based plants and pre-fabricated bio-digeste based plants. 2036 poor households are getting this support through Uttaran.



### **ICVGD** Project

Donor: : WFP

The objective of the project is eradication of extreme poverty and improving food security and nutrition of rural poor women in Bangladesh. Major activities of the project are as follows:

- -Intensive business support service to VGD women: VGD women producers are poorly connected to the quality inputs and technical knowledge needed to increase productivity.
- Private public partnership: A market systems approach to economic and social development
- Making Market Linkages: Identifying and linking poor VGD women producers to productive opportunities in the agriculture, poultry, livestock and other business sub-sectors.
- Value chain support: VGD women entrepreneurs need easy and quick access to cheaper raw materials that require combined warehousing facility and improved supply chain.

## Urban Management of Internal Migration due to Climate Change (UMIMCC) project

Vulnerable Climate Migrant residing in slum areas of Satkhira Municipality, were targeted by the project. The interventions of this project are: capacity building on climate resilient goat rearing technique, adoption of climate resilient technologies, business plan development, asset transfer and linkages with services and markets. The project primary selected 59 farmers and they have provided goat and goatshades. For another is the heifer approaces we have selected more 114 farmers and already transfered heifer to 37 farmers. The project selected and supported Forty farmers on low-cost fodder cultivation and feed preparation skill to the goat farmers as well as fodder entrepreneurs for their livelihoods. The model of this project is proposed for scaling up and Innovation as well through sheep rearing in the proposed project.
